Looking back, an amazing 25 years have passed and Montfort Care celebrates its 25th anniversary this year. I feel an overwhelming sense of gratitude for the privilege of walking this journey alongside many dedicated individuals and partners from our humble beginnings as a youth counselling centre and our very first Family Service Centre in Marine Terrace.

Today, Montfort Care has six key service pillars covering Anti-Violence, Child Protection, Caregiving, Family Service, Mental Health, and Eldercare (Goodlife), supported by Corporate Service and a workforce of 380. Indeed, we have organised ourselves to serve our clients from the young to the elderly; individuals and families facing a myriad of challenges in their lives at different life stages. My heart remains with *"Those whom the world rejects must move you the most"*, and this has been the purpose and foundation that we anchored Montfort Care on for the past two decades.

MontfortCare Anti-Violence

Montfort Care operates the National Anti-Violence and Sexual Harassment Helpline (NAVH) at 1800-777-0000 — a 24-hour national helpline that serves as a crucial first point of contact for those experiencing violence or abuse, whether within the family or in other challenging situations. The helpline provides timely support and connects individuals to the help they need.

Montfort Care Caregiving offers a wide range of services, including the JiaYou – Senior & Caregiver Hub, providing holistic support, practical assistance, and educational resources. Through these efforts, we aim to equip caregivers with the knowledge and tools needed to care for their loved ones with confidence throughout their caregiving journey.

At our Child Protection Specialist Centre, we are committed to keeping children safe and supporting families in times of difficulty. In addition, the Safe and Strong Family - Preservation (SSF-P) works intensively with families in crisis, ensuring that children can remain safely within their homes whenever possible while receiving the support they need to thrive.

Goodlife by Montfort Care is our aspiration for seniors to age well. It promotes active ageing and supports seniors in living well as they grow older. Programmes like Goodlife At Home bring essential personal care and HomeBathing services directly to seniors' homes.

Our Goodlife Studio Active Ageing Centres offer opportunities for seniors to engage socially and stay active. Goodlife Makan fosters a sense of community and companionship through meals prepared in our community kitchen. Our Community Case Management Service (CCMS) offers comprehensive support to help seniors age comfortably at home.

Family Service

Montfort Care Family Service supports individuals and families as they navigate life's challenges. Our programmes include Family Service Centres (FSC), which offer resources to build resilience and strengthen coping skills. FAM@FSC helps with marital, parenting, and financial issues. KidSTART @ Montfort Care supports families in early childhood development with a vision to give every child a good start in life, and Families for Life @ Community equips parents to raise resilient children.

Mental Health

Our mental health services offer holistic support for individuals with mental health conditions, including dementia. Through therapy, counselling, and case management, our Community Intervention Team (COMIT) and Community Outreach Team (CREST) connect individuals and caregivers with essential care and resources. For seniors newly diagnosed with dementia, the Post-Diagnostic Support Community Outreach Team (CREST-PDS) provides timely guidance and assistance.

Launching into the Future of Active Ageing Centres

April 2024

13 April 2024 marked an exciting milestone for Montfort Care with the official launch of Goodlife Studio. Held at the Goodlife Studio (Bukit Purmei), the closed-door event welcomed 80 community partners, including Guest of Honour Mr. Melvin Yong (MP for Radin Mas SMC), along with representatives from AIC, MOH, and Caritas. A lively carnival at the adjacent void deck offered guests a preview of the Studio's offerings.

An initiative by Montfort Care, Goodlife Studio is a suite of future-ready Active Ageing Centre (AAC) designed to empower seniors to embrace active ageing through five themed spaces: Tea Studio, Carpentry Studio, Digital Media Studio, Bike Kitchen, and Community Theatre. With engaging, hands-on programmes, Goodlife Studio encourages connection, creativity, and continued contribution, sparking strong interest and sign-ups following the event.



Celebrating 50 Years of Heart and Home

October 2024

Marine Parade holds deep meaning for Montfort Care—it's where our journey began over two decades ago with the establishment of Montfort Care Family Service (Marine Parade), supporting low-income families and seniors living alone. So when the estate turned 50, we were proud to celebrate with the community at Beyond 50: Love, Inspire, Transform.

Officiated by Dr. Tan See Leng—Minister and MP—the evening began with a symbolic

Light Up ceremony. Residents, beneficiaries, and partners from Goodlife Makan, Goodlife Studio, and beyond gathered to honour the estate's heritage and community spirit.

Activities themed around “Heritage”, “Retro”, and “Modern” brought people of all ages together through friendship band making, portrait drawing, and nostalgic games. The event celebrated not just Marine Parade's milestones, but also the bonds that make communities thrive. Montfort Care remains committed to inspiring change, transforming lives, and continuing this journey of care for the next 50 years and beyond.



A Light in the Cold for Rough Sleepers

September 2024

Rough sleepers often face stigma, going without not just shelter, but hope and support. That is why it was an honour for Montfort Care Family Service to join Minister Desmond Lee, Ministry of Social and Family Development, Ministry of National Development, Housing and Development Board, and Homeless Hearts of Singapore volunteers for a night walk at Harbourfront to support rough sleepers and the homeless.

Together, we helped pack belongings, offered shelter, and connected through conversation, listening to their stories with empathy and care. Though we work closely with this community year-round, Minister Lee's debrief reinforced the importance of collaboration and reminded us why continued support and compassion are essential to helping them rebuild their lives. The experience deepened our understanding of their needs and highlighted how small acts of kindness can make a big difference.



Raising Awareness & Advocacy

Meaningful change begins with understanding, and understanding starts with awareness. At Montfort Care, we believe that when people are informed about the challenges within their community, they are more likely to care, empathise, and take action. Our advocacy and awareness initiatives aim to educate the public on social issues, break down harmful stigmas, and foster compassion for vulnerable communities. When stigma is lifted, fear and judgment give way to empathy and support.

Awareness also paves the way for prevention. By helping people recognise early signs of distress or crisis, we can collectively work to prevent situations from worsening. More importantly, it encourages people to come together to create lasting, positive change, not just for individuals in need, but for society as a whole. Because when a community truly cares, it becomes a powerful force for hope, healing, and a better tomorrow.



Compassion for Caregivers

Hold Me Now: Exhibiting the World of Caregivers

August 2024 - February 2025

Most of us understand needing care, but far fewer understand what it truly means to give it. That's the premise of Hold Me Now, an immersive exhibition launched at JiaYou – Senior & Caregiver Hub. Created by Montfort Care in collaboration with Drama Box and led by Cultural Medallion recipient Mr. Kok Heng Leun, the exhibition invites visitors to explore the emotional landscape of caregiving through innovative art and interactive experiences from 24 August 2024 to 22 February 2025.



Through evocative installations and short film, it offered a powerful window into the emotional realities of caregiving. A standout piece came from artist anGie seah, who worked with 20 seniors to reimagine walking sticks not as symbols of frailty, but as expressive extensions of identity. This transformation—both artistic and emotional—embodied the exhibition's core: a tribute to the resilience, compassion, and unseen sacrifices of caregivers. To deepen the experience, volunteers were trained and engaged as facilitators. Their presence guided conversations, held space for reflection, and created a more personal and supportive environment for visitors. Hold Me Now did more than depict caregiving—it enabled audiences to feel its weight, appreciate its worth, and understand the collective support required to sustain it.



Empowering Through Navigation and Work

May - June 2024 & Ongoing

At the heart of caregiving is community—not just receiving support, but finding purpose in giving it back. Care Navigator is a programme developed by Montfort Care and SG Assist to empower vulnerable groups, particularly seniors, by equipping them with the skills and confidence to provide caregiver navigation support to others caring for elderly loved ones.

Open to Singaporeans and Permanent Residents aged 40 and above, the programme offers structured training and meaningful work opportunities that transform participants from service recipients into service contributors. They become navigators—walking alongside fellow caregivers, helping them understand the care landscape, access resources, and feel supported through their caregiving journey.

The programme also nurtures a spirit of volunteerism. Trained volunteers complement the efforts of employed navigators, extending peer support and practical help within the community. Their contributions not only lighten the load for others, but also strengthen social ties and mutual care.

More than just a service initiative, Care Navigator promotes financial independence and skill development. It taps into the lived experiences of older adults, harnessing their resilience as a valuable source of peer support. In doing so, it reduces long-term service dependency and builds capacity from within the community. The result is a quiet shift: from navigating care alone, to becoming empowered care enablers—strengthening a community where support is shared and sustained.



Mental Health Support That's Closer to Everyone

May 2024 & Ongoing

Mental health has long been a taboo subject, often burdened by stigma, misunderstanding, and scepticism. This can lead individuals to isolate themselves, reject support, and remain in denial. Left unaddressed, such issues create ripple effects—impacting families, shaping communities, and contributing to generational trauma.

At Montfort Care, we believe that one of the most important steps toward breaking these barriers is creating space for honest conversations. Psychosocial education plays a vital role in raising awareness and encouraging those who are struggling to seek help. Over the past year, our COMIT and CREST teams have worked tirelessly to promote mental well-being—supporting

individuals and families, while also connecting with the wider community through talks, roadshows, and exhibitions. Our partnerships with organisations, companies, and healthcare providers have helped extend our reach. A highlight was our World Mental Health Day celebration at Gardens by the Bay, where attendees engaged in interactive, sensory-based activities designed to deepen understanding of mental wellness. It was a powerful reminder: mental health is a journey best taken together.



Strong Communities Begin with Strong Families

Supported Parents, Thriving Children

April 2024 & Ongoing

Parenting is a journey without a manual—shaped by how we were raised, what we value, and our hopes for our children. While parenting styles may differ, all parents share one goal: to give their children the best. We may not be able to change the world, but we can shape a nurturing, safe environment at home.



This year, Montfort Care Families for Life @ Community (FFLC) programme supported over 700 parents and caregivers through more than 20 talks and seminars. In collaboration with schools, partners, and community groups, these sessions covered a wide spectrum, from parenting styles, emotional regulation, resilience, and mindfulness to cyber wellness, grandparenting, and positive discipline.

These sessions empower parents with tools, perspectives, and a safe, judgment-free space to learn and grow. Every session encourages open sharing, compassion, and practical strategies to support families at every stage of their journey. It's a powerful first step towards healing, stronger family bonds, and raising resilient children in today's complex world.



Safeguarding Childhood for Brighter Tomorrows

August 2024 & Ongoing

Children's understanding of the world is shaped by the environment they grow up in. Those raised in abusive or unsafe homes often carry trauma and mistrust into adulthood. Meanwhile, those with safe, happy childhoods may struggle to relate to experiences beyond their own. To bridge this divide, Montfort Care—together with its partners—engaged both children and future social workers to equip them for the awareness and tools to recognise and respond to abuse.

These included an educational session with Nanyang Polytechnic's Social Work students, a joyful Children's Day celebration, and a visit to the Science Centre that encouraged learning and bonding. Through these efforts, children were reminded that they are seen, heard, and valued, while students gained a deeper understanding of child protection. Empowered with this awareness, children are more likely to seek help and even extend it to others. At Montfort Care, protecting childhood means building a safer, more compassionate future for all.



Strengthening Partnerships and Collaborations

Building, protecting, and uniting a community takes more than just passion—it takes people coming together. While we're grateful to do the work we do, we know it wouldn't be possible without the many kindred spirits who've stood beside us. Their support, trust, and collaboration have empowered us to go further, reach wider, and do more.

This past year has been one of connection—of meaningful partnerships, shared goals, and collective impact. Whether through alliances, joint initiatives, or CSR collaborations, every effort has helped move the needle for the communities we serve. We are deeply honoured by the trust placed in us and inspired by the recognition of our shared work. If there's one thing we hope to see from all these connections, it's continuity. That the spirit of giving continues beyond us, through them. That the impact lives on, carried forward by those who believe in doing good, together.



Supporting Every Hand That Gives and Receives Care

August 2024

Needing care can feel just as heavy as providing it. For many older adults, the loss of independence can lead to feelings of shame and isolation. For caregivers, the emotional and physical toll of constant care often goes unnoticed, hidden behind quiet smiles and tired nods.

These unspoken struggles are what JiaYou – Senior & Caregiver Hub aims to address. A first-of-its-kind integrated service hub

in Singapore, JiaYou is a collaboration between Montfort Care, Fei Yue Community Services, and Yong-en Care Centre, with the support of NCSS. Offering a single point of access across the three agencies, the hub provides a comprehensive suite of services, including dementia and mental health support, home care, employment, and caregiver training. JiaYou empowers seniors to live with joy and dignity, while equipping caregivers with the tools they need.

Because at JiaYou, we believe care should never be a burden—it should be a shared journey, full of hope.



Uniting Minds Across Sectors for Greater Impact

February & April 2025

Making meaningful change takes passion and purpose, but it also takes insight and perspective. At Montfort Care, we recognise that our understanding is shaped by the lens we view the world through.

That's why we actively seek collaboration with like-minded partners who share our values and commitment to the community. Sessions such as the Networking Session at the Headquarters of the Central Narcotics Bureau (CNB) and the Learning Journey to the Institute of Mental Health (IMH), both with Child Protective Service, were key opportunities for cross-sector sharing and reflection.

Through open dialogue and the exchange of ideas, we deepened our understanding of early intervention, holistic care, mental health challenges, and crisis response strategies. These shared insights will shape our approach and strengthen the initiatives we roll out on the ground. We believe collaboration isn't just supportive—it's catalytic. Together, we move forward with greater clarity, stronger partnerships, and a renewed drive to make a lasting difference.



Strengthening Support for Vulnerable Seniors

Ongoing

Each month, Medical Social Workers from Changi General Hospital (CGH) and Social Workers from the Community Case Management Service (CCMS) meet virtually to coordinate personalised care for seniors who need it most. From providing updates to developing strategies that would ensure effective responses and reduce risks of readmissions, the meetings cover everything needed for the seniors they care for. These sessions are more than case discussions—they're spaces to listen, learn, and work together for better lives. With every meeting, they bring warmth, clarity, and compassion to those they serve.



Every Life is a Story Worth Telling

November 2024

Many of us feel our lives are too ordinary to matter. Without fame or grand achievements, we wonder who would care to hear our stories. But the truth is—every life holds meaning, and every story deserves to be heard. To help seniors recognise the value of their journeys, Montfort Care, in collaboration with Mediacorp CAPITAL 958, launched The Voice Museum Project.

This initiative invited seniors to craft their own audio-biographies, reflecting on their past, shaping their narratives, and learning the art of voice storytelling. What emerged was more than just recordings. It became a healing process, as participants revisited, reconnected with, and found peace in their memories. Listening to their stories in their own voices was deeply moving—there wasn't a dry eye when the project wrapped. This collaboration reminded us that even the most unassuming life is rich with meaning. Every story matters—especially our own.

Environment, Climate Risk, and Waste Management



We are working to reduce our environmental impact. Through our Goodlife programmes, seniors take part in recycling and upcycling activities. Our HomeBathing service now uses electric vehicles—cutting carbon emissions by up to 65%—and staff are encouraged to take public transport for short trips.



Workplace Safety, Health, and Well-being



We aim to provide a safe, inclusive, and supportive workplace. Our updated Employee Code of Conduct promotes diversity, equity, inclusion (DEI), while new learning and development programmes support career growth. A dedicated mental wellness platform was introduced, with 52% of staff adopting it within half a year. These efforts are guided by feedback from our Great Place to Work survey.

We uphold high standards in data protection and accountability. We maintained a whistleblowing policy with zero tolerance for retaliation, and conducted an assessment of Board effectiveness to continuously improve governance. We are set to achieve Data Protection Trustmark certification by 2025, reinforcing our commitment to digital trust.

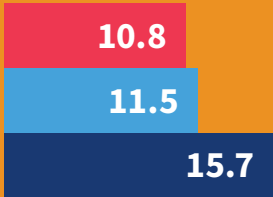

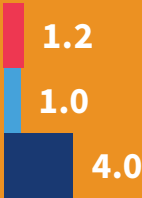
